

Inviting Applications for the EDITORSHIP-in-CHIEF OF ***EPILEPSIA***

ILAE invites applications for the position of Editor(s)-in-Chief of ***Epilepsia***, to replace Philip Schwartzkroin and Simon Shorvon whose term of duty in this position will end June 30, 2013.

Details of the duties of the Editor(s)-in-Chief are available from Priscilla Shisler at pshisler@ILAE.org. In addition to the duties involved in editing ***Epilepsia***, the new Editor(s)-in-chief will be expected to oversee any diversification in the League's publications in line with the ILAE mission of global education and outreach, and to work closely with the ILAE Information Officer, Web Editor, and Commission on Education.

The initial appointment will be for 4 years, renewable for an additional 4 years. The Editor(s)-in Chief will be appointed as non-voting members of the ILAE Executive Committee. The post is not remunerated, although reasonable expenses are paid in accord with ILAE policy.

Candidates are invited to submit an application which should include:

- 1) Curriculum vitae;
- 2) Details of previous relevant editorial experience; and
- 3) Plans for the Journal.

If the application is for a joint editorship (as currently exists), the application should also describe how the co-editors will share responsibilities and work together.

Applicant finalists will be interviewed by a subcommittee of the ILAE Executive Committee, and an appointment finalized by December 2012. It is envisaged that the successful applicant(s) will work with the current Editors-in-Chief in a transition phase from January 2013.
