ACTIVITIES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

2021

- The German-Austrian-Swiss Epilepsy Congress in Berlin had to be postponed until 2023.
- We cooperated with Prof. Stephan Rüegg for his biannual "Basel Epilepsy Day" as our annual meeting. The theme was "Fitness to drive important not only for people with epilepsy". The meeting took place on 19 August 2021 as a face-to-face event with special restrictions (more space, COVID certificate check), 225 persons were registered.
- The Annual General Meeting in May had to take place virtually.

2022

- The ILAE European Epilepsy Congress took place in Geneva, 9-13 July 2022.
 Former board member Prof. Margitta Seeck co-chaired it, and many League members were intensely involved in the scientific programme. The Swiss League organized a drinks reception ("Swiss Apero") for its members and friends on the terrace of a nearby Italian restaurant.
- For the first time since the start of the pandemic, the Annual General Meeting in May
 was held as a hybrid event, with most of the old and new board members attending in
 person in Olten.

- Biannual Alfred Hauptmann Award in 2021 (€10′000) in cooperation with the German and Austrian chapter
- In future, the Hauptmann award will be funded by four different sponsors; the prize money is now €20,000, divided between basic and clinical research.
- Swiss Epilepsy Research Network "SERENE": https://www.epi.ch/en/research/serene/
- In 2021, for the first time, the Tissot Medal (honorary prize for special services to Swiss epileptology) was awarded to a woman. The recipient, Anne Beaumanoir, died in 2022 https://www.epi.ch/en/in-memoriam-anne-beaumanoir/
- Since the beginning of the pandemic, many events for people with epilepsy have been successfully organized online, together with the IBE chapter Epi-Suisse. Some events took place face-to-face or hybrid. Total attendance 2021-22: in-person 299; online 423.
- In 2022, most professional events were hybrid. In 2021, 195 people attended our face-to-face events including the annual meeting in Basel; in 2022, our professional events had 41 in-person and 90 online participants.
- Our website www.epi.ch is updated constantly, for example it now contains information about riding a bicycle with epilepsy, about hormones and bone fractures.
- Answers to medical questions, about 200 questions a year. Important new topics were the new coronavirus and vaccinations.
- Media activities resulting in several articles, radio and TV features; cooperation with "BrainMag"
- Donation of anti-seizure drugs to Ukraine soon after the Russian invasion; personal contacts to the Ukrainian ILAE chapter at the European Epilepsy Congress in Geneva
- We submitted a request for health insurance to cover the cost of regular osteoporosis screening for patients who have been taking "old" anti-seizure medication for more than 10 years.
- We got involved so that people with epilepsy could also donate blood so far without success.
- Sponsorship rules: We have set out rules governing our engagement with industry, including our independence, transparency, data protection and the ban on monosponsorship.
- The League has become an official partner of the Swiss Neurological Society.

CHALLENGES FACED IN 2021 AND 2022

 The coronavirus pandemic had only a limited impact due to liberal regulations in Switzerland. However, planning events and finding partners (hospitals) had become more difficult, partly due to staff shortages. Also, the return of face-to-face participants was slow, as many people had become accustomed to online events. Our office also suffered from several medical absences. This meant that some projects had to be delayed.



- At the end of 2021, applications for our awards were slow to come in, so we decided to
 extend the deadlines. Increased communication, including by post, was successful and
 at the end we were pleased with the number of entries.
- Finances remain a challenge. Despite increasing success in fundraising, regular income continues to fall short of expenditure.

- We will be a guest association at the annual meeting of the Swiss Neurological Society in 2024.
