

- 16th Epilepsy International Symposium in Hamburg 1200 delegates Colombia, Ecuador, Guatemala, Indonesia and Yugoslavia join the ILAE 1985

- Publication of first edition of Epilepsy Syndromes in infancy, childhood and adolescence 1985
- 1986 Landmark studies of prognosis in epilepsy published in Epilepsia
- 17th Epilepsy International Congress in Jerusalem 1126 delegates and satellite symposia for the first time 1987
- 1987 Algeria and Australia join the ILAE
- Treatment gap in epilepsy first calculated in three countries
 Hungary, Morocco, Panama, Venezuela and Zaire join the ILAE, and Cuba, Sweden and Peru submit revised constitutions. The ILAE now consisted of 39 chapters
- Wave of new drugs begins, with the introduction of vigabatrin in Europe and Zonisamide in Japan 1989
- 1989 18th International Epilepsy Congress in New Delhi
- 1980 Commercial production of genetically engineered insulin
- 1981 AIDs first described
- 1982 Prions first described by Stanley Prusiner
- 1983 H. pylori described as a cause of stomach ulcers by Robin Warren and Barry Marshall
- 1984 HIV identified

- 1985 BSE first formally described
- 1986 First heart, lung and liver transplant
- 1986 First monoclonal antibody drug
- 1987 Prozac makes its debut
- 1988 Fluvoxetine approved by the FDA
