Peter Jeavons (1920–1997)



Peter Jeavons' interest in epilepsy spanned the entire spectrum from babies to old age. In his work in Birmingham, England, he was Head of both the Epilepsy Service at Dudley Road Hospital and The Convulsions Clinic at Birmingham Children's Hospital. A psychiatrist by origin, he entered both the fields of epilepsy and EEG because of his earlier experiences at All Saints Psychiatric Hospital in Birmingham. His growing interests caused him to give up his career as a psychiatrist and become a consultant in EEGs. During his working life he produced more than 100 publications, many of which appeared in *Epilepsia*, as well as three books. In the 1960s, he published, with his colleague Dr. Brian Bower, one of the earliest monographs on children with infantile spasms.

In 1964 he began working with Professor Graham Harding on photosensitive epilepsy; over the next 30 years they studied almost 1,000 cases of this condition, by far the largest group of this type ever studied in the world. Many publications stemmed from these studies identifying both the role of television in provoking this type of seizure and different forms of physical therapy, many of which were often simple, such as covering one eye in the presence of a flickering light stimulus or making sure the patient sits >2 m from the television set. He was instrumental in the introduction of valporate (VPA) into the United Kingdom to treat patients with this and other epileptic conditions and assisted in obtaining approval for this drug in the United States. He carried out a number of studies investigating the prognosis of photosensitive epilepsy and, indeed, his final joint paper with Graham Harding is about to be published in this journal.

For his services to epilepsy he was awarded the title of Ambassador for Epilepsy by The International League and, in 1984, Aston University awarded him an Honorary DSc. He was also elected to Fellowship of the Royal College of Physicians (London). He retired from the U.K. National Health Service at the age of 60, but continued to work at Aston University for the following 15 years. A flamboyant figure, he was happily married to Patsy Jeavons and is survived by her and his son Michael, a psychiatrist in Canada.
