Short biography

Dr. Caraballo specialized in neurology and epilepsy with Dr. Natalio Fejerman in Buenos Aires and Prof. Bernardo Dalla Bernardina at the University of Verona. In 1993 he visited the seizure unit of Miami Children hospital under Dr. Michael Duchowny where he studied refractory epilepsies and epilepsy surgery. He set up a clinic for refractory epilepsy at the Garrahan Hospital in Buenos Aires, Argentina, a tertiary national and Latin-American referral center. In research, Dr. Caraballo has a special interest in the definition of epilepsy syndromes and new treatments for pharmacoresistent epilepsies. He has provided training positions for young epileptologists, encouraging them not only in their clinical work, but in research as well. At Garrahan hospital, special attention is being given to the training of neurologists from more remote places in Argentina as well as other Latin-American countries, where specialized centers are lacking. These young neurologists go back to their provinces or countries with a solid formation and additionally have the possibility to stay in touch for consultation and referral of patients. Dr. Caraballo also worked on education programs in epilepsy for the general public, teachers, and priests in Argentina. He received a university degree in education, with the aim to further develop training programs for young epileptologists in Latin America. Recently, Dr. Caraballo has become principal investigator of the CONICET, the Argentine Research Council.
