

Walter van Emde Boas (1942) studied medicine in Amsterdam. Following a PhD degree in basic neuroscience (1973) and MD (1974) he trained as a neurologist, paediatric neurologist and clinical neurophysiologist in Amsterdam and Utrecht.

In 1982 he joined the Epilepsy Clinic "Meer & Bosch", now part of the Dutch Epilepsy Clinics Foundation (SEIN), as from 1985 as director of the departments of EEG and the Epilepsy Monitoring Units in Heemstede and —as of 1999- also in Zwolle.

Since early retirement in Jan. 2003 he acts as senior consultant and supervisor in both clinics and continues his international consulting and teaching activities, notably in the former Soviet occupied countries.

As a key member and, for 2003-2008, chair of the Dutch Collaborative Epilepsy Surgery Program he played a central role in development of the flourishing program for adult and paediatric epilepsy surgery in the Netherlands.

He is a (honorary) member of numerous national and international scientific societies, a frequent invited lecturer in the fields of EEG diagnosis, presurgical evaluation and surgical treatment of epilepsy in adults and children and is (co)author of over 60 peer reviewed journal papers and book chapters.

He has served ILAE in numerous commissions, including the ILAE commissions on classification and terminology, on neurosurgery and on education. At present he chairs the taskforce on distance education.
