It is an honor for me to be nominated to become a member of the Commission on North American Affairs of the ILAE. Should I be elected to participate in this Commission, I would bring my experience as a current President of the Canadian League Against Epilepsy (CLAE), a former Director of Education of the CLAE, and my experience as a member of different committees of the American Epilepsy Society (AES), including my current role of Vice-Chair on the Council of Communication. Furthermore, I have participated in this Commission in the past as the Chair of a Task Force on Disparities in Epilepsy Care in North America. All these interactions with North American colleagues has allowed me to grow as a professional delivering care to those with epilepsy and as an academician with a focus on the education of residents in neurology and fellows in epilepsy.
