- k. A new Joint ILAE/IBE European legal entity was established in Ireland to enable the EAE (JTF) to apply for EU grants
- I. Established a collaboration with the European Academy of Neurology (EAN). A joint CEA-EAN-WG was formed to substantiate this collaboration as well as a joint educational initiative
- m. EAN-CEA joint symposia were held at the 2016-EAN, 2016-ECE and 2017-EAN congresses

- a. Reduced funding for the CEA-Core Courses (CCC) to \$15,000
- b. A migrating course will materialize only upon demand and secured local findings by the host chapter
- c. A selected non-core courses will be supported as a CSA up to \$5000 per course
- d. Total expenditure on CSAs:\$30,000
