

Epilepsy surgery in the Philippines

Abstract

One of the milestones in the management of epilepsy in the Philippines is the formation of the Philippine League Against Epilepsy in 1996. A number of projects have been implemented to improve the public awareness and care of putnets with epilepsy. The comprehensive cpilepsy program was established in 1997, mainly based at the St. Luke Medical Center, Manila. This program is comprised of a multidisciplinary team with facilities inclusive of video-EEG/MRJ PET and intrapperative ECOG. Video-EEG monitoring is also available in two other hospitals. Public reluctance, high costs, and sociocultural factors are some of the reasons for underutilization of the surgical option for epilepsy treatment in Philippines.

Epilepsy in Philippine language and dialects

Abstract

In the Philippines, English and Filipino (standardized Tagalog) are widely used for media and education. "Epilepsy" and "kumbulsyon" are commonly used terms; "epilepsy" carries a negative connotation based on a local unpublished epilepsy knowledge, attitude and perception survey. Several popular dialects have epilepsy names (patrol in Cebuano, Josopi in Bioggo, hostog in Bioclano, Aissibe in Bocano) but most are descriptions of the convulsive attack. Labels for persons with epilepsy also exist (hontogon, Josopon, epilepsic).

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The Philippine Lague Against Epilepsy has a community project which has been named, The Epilepsy Manager Program. It was created to address the needs of patients with epilepsy in the rural areas. As Epilepsy Manager is defined as a non-Neurologist who will reader care to persons with epilepsy in the primary care level, in areas of the country where access to Neurologist service is not readily available. The program focuses on trainings of the Epilepsy Managers, It uses a proception-lip-guided, handon on strategy. Government doctors or Municipal Health Officers in different provinces volunteer for the program, after it has been fully explained to them. This paper describes the process involved for the training of Epilepsy Managers, and the results of the program after 9 years of implementation.
