I am honoured to be nominated for membership on the Commission on North American Affairs for the 2017-21 term of the ILAE. I am a Neuropsychologist with over 30 years of experience in assessment and research with children and adults with epilepsy. I have worked on several ILAE taskforces, including Neuropsychology, Pediatric Surgery, and Pediatric Comorbidities. I have also been involved in the Canadian League Against Epilepsy (as secretary of the Board of Directors) and the American Epilepsy Society (as a member and at present as co-chair of the Psychosocial Comorbidities Committee). These opportunities have allowed me to take my clinical and research experience to the stage of translation into education and skills that benefit the wider epilepsy community from professionals to patients.
