



Wolfgang Löscher is Professor and Director of the Department of Pharmacology, Toxicology and Pharmacy at the University of Veterinary Medicine Hannover, as well as Head of the Center for Systems Neuroscience in Hannover, Germany. He was born in Berlin, Germany, and graduated from the Free University of Berlin in 1974 with a degree in Veterinary Medicine. He pursued postgraduate training and specialization in Pharmacology, particularly Neuropharmacology, and Toxicology in Germany, Denmark, and the United States and holds board certifications in these specialties. He has held posts in academical institutions and pharmaceutical industry and was appointed to the Department of Pharmacology in Hannover in 1987. His research interests are in the pharmacology of antiepileptic drugs, the mechanisms of pharmacoresistance in epilepsy, and the pathophysiology of temporal lobe epilepsy with the aim to find new targets for treatment. He has over 400 refereed publications and has obtained several awards for this research, including the American Epilepsy Society's Epilepsy Research Award for Basic Science Research in 2006.
