A super-successful IEC 2019 came to a close with the YES General Assembly Meeting. We revised our terms of reference, confirmed the current Leadership Team for the first regular 2-year term (2019-2021), and elected new task force leaders. REPORT OF THE YES PROGRAMME AT THE 4TH AFRICAN EPILEPSY CONGRESS, ENTEBBE, UGANDA

YES–Town Hall Meeting. Co-chaired by Helen Cross (UK) and Jo Wilmshurst (South Africa), Musa Watila introduced what is YES and its aims, and described how to get involved. In addition, he discussed the key outcomes and future directions for YES in Africa.



Dr Edward Kija (Tanzania), Charles Hammond (Ghana), and Robert Sebunya (Uganda) gave an overview of the challenges and opportunities they faced as young clinicians and researchers in sub-Saharan Africa. This was followed by a Q&A session. Some of the issues raised were difficulties faced by young professionals regarding training and funding opportunities. A major threat discussed was the impact of brain-drain on epilepsy care. Another challenge recognised was what Edward Kija called 'brain-in-the-drain' – a situation where trained professionals waste their talent due lack of equipment, bureaucratic bottlenecks, and opposition from less-trained senior colleagues. There was a great discussion on how YES could help coordinate these activities.

At the first YES-Africa meeting, elections for leadership positions were held:

Interactive Media – Expansion of the social media channels, including content being available in multiple languages #tf-interactivemedia


